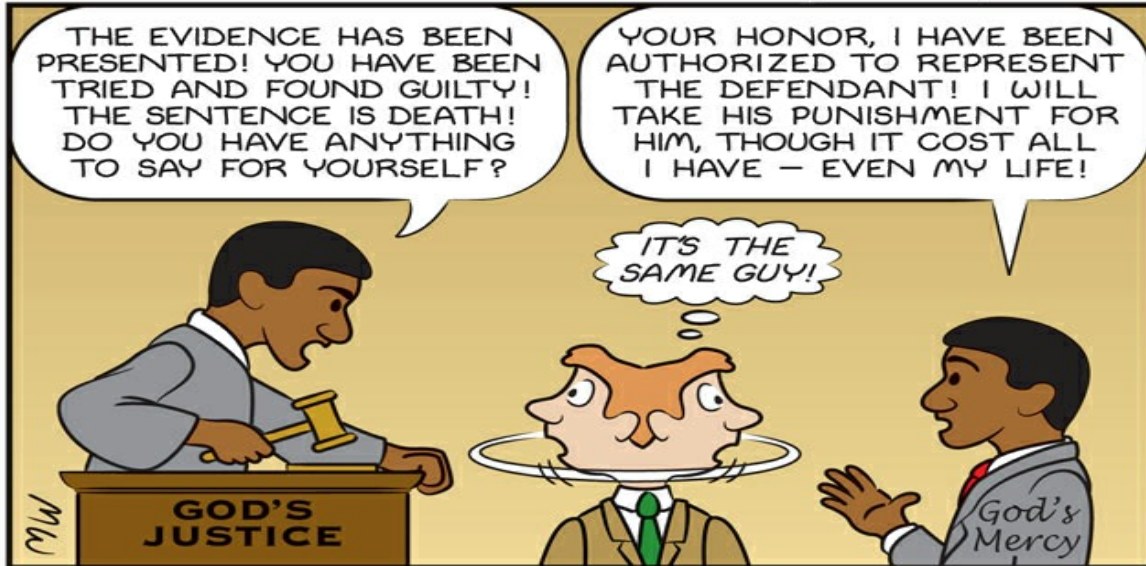

Minister's Letter March 2019 : Political Justice

Many of you will be completely fed up with the political state of affairs at the moment and perhaps also know that I rarely venture into that arena. Further, I wish that politicians would just as rarely venture into spiritual matters when they have no clue whatsoever about these things either. But by the end of March we are supposed to be out of the European Union. This week some politicians took a swipe at their party ethics and stance on a number of issues and have defected.

I believe that our nation needs a new political system. The current one lacks the right kind of moral vision which will enable our nation to flourish. Having written to my MP on a few occasions, I received a reply basically saying she would vote in opposition to my view because it would be detrimental to her friend - I wrongly thought MPs represented "the people". However, many of our political issues are ones which Christian morality and ethics would completely solve. Yes, if we were all living under the government of God, society would be in a much better place all round. For example, loving our neighbour would eradicate homelessness, the need for food-banks and in another areas we would be looking after our environment a whole lot better than we currently do. Corruption and crime would fall and we would not need nearly as many politicians.

The injustices in our society would be righted. It is worth noting that any human agenda cannot solve injustice like God can. He is **just** and merciful, full of compassion and abounding in love - how does that compare with your MP or political party?

Instead of wasting large sums of money on weapons and equipment for our armed forces we could engage in battle with the real enemy of all people, the devil. He is the one who tells us what we often want to hear; look after yourself, aim for all kinds of material wealth, don't deprive yourself of anything your heart desires etc. etc.

Of course God warns us that the devil is a deceiver and a liar who loves to prevent people from realising their full potential which is through becoming followers of Jesus Christ.

During WWI and WWII the churches were full to overflowing with people beseeching God to be on our side and to thwart the enemy. At this time of uncertainty and spiritual confusion, we all need to ask God to illuminate our minds, change our wrong attitudes and behaviours, and to help us to worship the one who is **just** and good, and to come sort out our mess!

In 1979 Traidcraft was established as a Christian response to poverty. For 40 years now Traidcraft has campaigned for fair trade, advocating sustainability and transparency in trade. In 2019 reorganisation of their business model was necessary and a scaled down operation now sees Traidcraft focussing on core food stuffs. Their sister charity, Traidcraft Exchange, supports many life-changing projects and campaigns across the world. By guaranteeing its partner producers a fair minimum price and improved working conditions Traidcraft Exchange helps families out of poverty. Enabling producers to earn a fair income for their work reduces exploitation and encourages self-sufficiency in food, healthcare and education. The charity actively campaigns to transform trade and promote fairer trading practices. It also works to influence policy makers and tackle the underlying causes of poverty and injustice.

Article Series 9 (pt 10) Justification

Please pray before you read Romans 4:1-25 Through FAITH !

Justification is a term Christians use to mean being acquitted at the court of God's judgement, with God **crediting His followers with the status of righteousness** by His New Covenant promise; through the Gospel which Jesus brought; and which is accepted in faith by believing the word of God.

What a complicated definition! But, this is what lies at the heart of Romans chapter 4. Paul draws on the Old Testament using Abraham and David as examples of what God is teaching us here.

In v1, 2 we see that Abraham was **justified** by faith, and not works, contrary to what many people, including the Jews, have believed. In v3 Paul quotes Genesis 15:6 where works are not mentioned. There we see Abraham was credited with righteousness not for anything he had done other than having true faith in God.

The example of David v6-8 says a similar thing. God forgives and does not count it against those who confess their sin and accept God's gracious solution.

v9-12 speak of the ritual of circumcision, which the Jews adhere to, believing that this religious ritual along with a sincere attempt to keep the Law would **justify** them as righteous. In v10 Paul points out that Abraham was **credited as righteous** 14 years before he was circumcised (see Genesis 14, 17 & Galatians 3:17) So Abraham links the circumcised Jews with the uncircumcised Gentiles incorporating them into God's **justification** plan with no need for rituals.

In v13-15 Paul elaborates further on the wrong assumption that keeping the Law **justifies** us in God's New Covenant. In the Old Covenant this was what God asked of His chosen people, the Jews. Now, and as seen in Abraham the New and better covenant incorporates everyone. We are not justified through the Law v13 because the Law brings wrath to those who break its rules v15.

This is then reaffirmed in the form of a short summary in v16. The giving of eternal life to dead sinners, is of God alone v17, and as we now know is through faith alone. Abraham hoped in God alone, not in anything of himself v18.

Though Abraham had some shaky moments, his faith is held up to us as a good example v19-24. Abraham believed God would do what He promised even though naturally it would be impossible. Hebrews 11:1 defines this faith: "**Now faith is the assurance of what we hope for and the certainty of what we do not see.**" Is our faith like this? v24 teaches us that as per Abraham's faith and the **justification** he received, this is now also available for all Christians.

Our chapter ends with a confessional formula which originates in Isaiah 53:12. This is a fabulous passage as is God's gift of **justification** by faith. Have you grasped this yet? Is it worth reading through a number of times and reflecting upon it? May we all enjoy the riches of God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

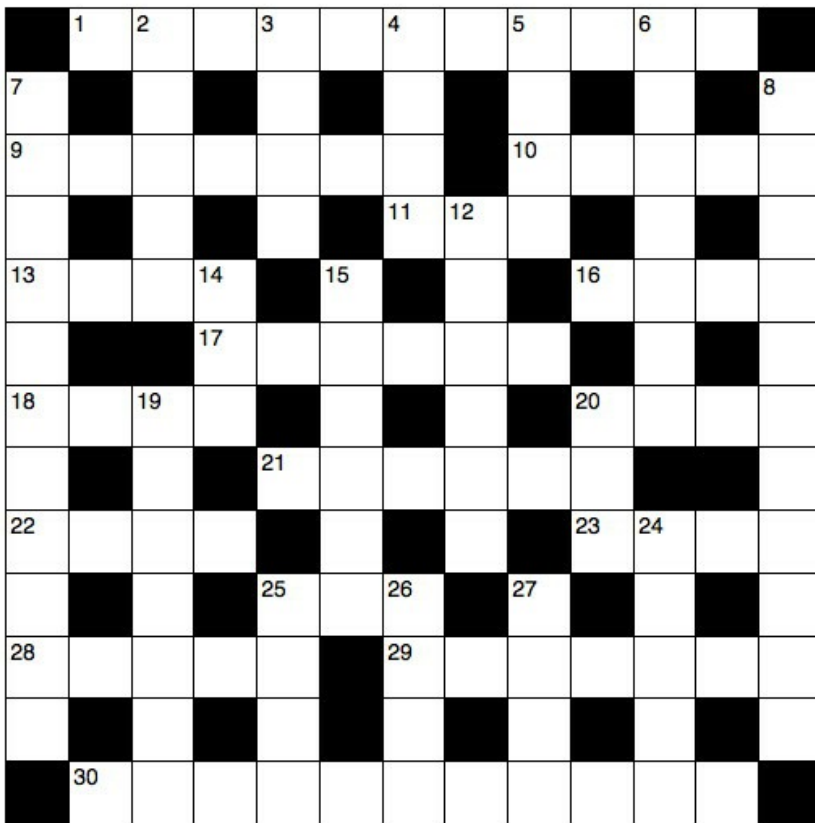

TEEN PAGE....Humility

February saw the sad passing of Gordon Banks. Now, most of you probably won't know much about him, if anything at all. In fact, I can almost claim he was before my time! Gordon Banks was a rare thing indeed, he was a British world cup winner, something only his team mates from England's win in 1966 can claim. He also won FIFA best goalkeeper in the world award six years in a row and of course he is probably best known for "that save". Playing Brazil in the world cup, a goal bound header from Pele (best player of all time) was somehow tipped over the bar by Banks, a save that has been voted the best of all time.

Tragically, Banks' career was cut short when he lost the sight in one eye in a car crash. Had he been playing today, Banks would have been a multi-millionaire, a world superstar, on par with Messi and Ronaldo. Sadly, he had to sell his world cup medal, so he could raise enough money for a deposit for a house for his children. In today's game, he would have earned more in a week.

I think we could have forgiven him if he had become bitter but all the tributes this week suggest the opposite, he remained a quiet, humble man who would do anything for you. Particularly poignant was a tribute from Peter Shilton, who became Banks successor at Stoke and England. Banks basically had to train him up, knowing he would soon take his place. He did this with enthusiasm and grace and remained a friend to him.

Humility is a strange word, full of contradictions. In this modern world of self-promotion, achieved at all costs, where confidence bordering on arrogance is seen as a positive attribute, where does humility fit in?

Read the account of Saul and Samuel (**1 Samuel, chapters 9 and 10**). In these chapters we see Samuel, who had been chosen by God to lead Israel, being told by God that Saul was to be the new leader, even though Samuel knew it was against God's will. Saul was a big, impressive man, however, was from the smallest tribe and couldn't even find some donkey's he was looking for, never mind rule over the complicated Israelite nation! Later we see Saul prophesying! That was Samuel's skill, that's what he did! Samuel must have been confused, why would God give Israel a king, when Samuel knew it would anger God? Samuel could easily have questioned God, justifiably from a human perspective. He was the spiritual leader of Israel, chosen by God, why was God bowing to the peoples' request to provide a king? As we follow the story we see Samuel do God's will without hesitation or grumbling, even though Samuel knew that the Israelites wanted a king for all the wrong reasons and it would anger God. He humbled himself and accepted what God wanted him to do. Samuel had to reduce his status and proclaim someone else who would take over from him.

Sometimes real humility comes through accepting God's plan, even when we don't understand it or don't agree with it.

Take time to consider each of the following verses and how they can affect you practically:
Reverence for the Lord is an education in itself. You must be humble before you can ever receive honours. (Proverbs 15:33)

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. (Ephesians 4:2)

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. (Matthew 11:29)

He used to help Christians who were being persecuted by the emperor Claudius. Apparently, Claudius thought single men were better soldiers, so Valentine secretly married Christians to help the men avoid war. In the end he was clubbed to death and beheaded on February 14th 269. They say Valentine became friends with the daughter of his jailor, healing her from blindness. On the day of his execution he left her a note signed: *'your Valentine'*. Hence the cards we now send.

What a cultural shift it would be if we acted like Valentine today. Perhaps offering to pray for someone who is sick, visiting folks in hospital, helping decorate someone's house, taking shopping round to someone housebound, making soup for the Big Q (just saying!). We're unlikely to be persecuted for it but we might be inconvenienced. I was touched, yesterday at Basics Bank that all the women of the Basics Bank were given a single red rose by a friend of the BB community. What a thoughtful, generous, gesture of love. It's such an honour to be part of a group forming a warm, loving, accepting, community where Jesus's love can be experienced hands on - week by week. Then at the Big Q on Mondays Tim Greene, Ian Manning and myself attempt to explain who Jesus is and help people towards him our new Freedom in Christ Course.

Every second Wednesday we meet at Diana and Tim Greene's home for *'Tattie Table'*. It's a bring and share meal where we eat baked potatoes with delicious fillings then discover what the bible says about life, the universe and everything. This is a space for enquirers – folks who aren't sure what they believe but they enjoy good food, good company and a good chat. If there is someone you know who might be interested in joining us please get in touch with me or Tim Greene.

Our aim, in all of our groups, is to accept people where they are and to show them love. Sometimes even with chocolates and roses.

Concern for Creation – Ecumenical eco-group meeting with MSP at Dunbar Parish Church

The Scottish parliament will be debating a Climate Bill in March, and campaigners are lobbying their Members of the Scottish Parliament (MSPs) on the importance of taking ambitious action to cut climate change emissions. On 25th January a group of people from several local churches, including Dunbar Parish, St Anne's Episcopal, Quaker and Roman Catholic, met with Paul Wheelhouse, an SNP member for South Scotland. We expressed the Christian concern to be good stewards of the created world, and loving neighbours to all those with whom we share this planet.

Fortified with information provided by Stop Climate Chaos Scotland and WWF we put forward the case for strong action to drastically curb Scotland's polluting emissions in the next 10 years, and to reduce to zero net carbon emissions by 2050 at the latest (a pledge already made by Sweden, France and Iceland). Mr Wheelhouse was very well-informed (he had previously been a Climate Change Minister) and receptive to both the technical points and our desire for Scotland to be one of the countries leading the way on reducing emissions to curb global warming and climate chaos.
