Ministers Letter November 2016: Humbly needing God

The festive (Advent) Season is nearly upon us and it has been a particularly mild year so far - still no frost, snow or hail, Recently I have been thinking about mild in another sense - mild mannered, meek or humble. Moses was known for his meekness and no one has shown greater humility than our Saviour Jesus Christ. Yet, He is the King of Kings and the one true LORD of us all. He is the one we MUST worship and acknowledge.

Words and music from the Hymn, "At the name of Jesus" are singing in my ears. They cry out, "At the Name of Jesus, every knee shall bow"; "Humbled for a season, to receive a name...Faithfully He bore it, spotless to the last"; "He is God the Saviour, He is Christ the Lord, Ever to be worshipped, trusted and adored." These are just some of the lines.

Of course pride is the antonym of humility. Only the proud and haughty can be proud of their humility, especially when they enjoy being humbly open about all their achievements, kindness and good deeds, etc. etc.

Article Series 8 (pt 7) "God must be acknowledged"

Please read *Daniel 4:1-27*: It's not enough to believe God exists! Nebuchadnezzar had become so powerful that his renown and words reach "nations and people of every language" v1. He believes that he has something so great to tell them, and it is both a pleasure and a blessing to share it for their prosperity v2, 3

So after feeling content with all his wealth, power and renown while in the palace, and presumably while he takes a nap, he has another dream v4, 5. It is a nightmare in truth and he summons all his experts to help him to understand it. But notice that once again he looks to those who cannot and could not previously help v6, 7. He is still playing at being God - as if money and his power can give him everything - but actually it cannot.

So Daniel, God's man, steps in again v8. He calls Daniel by the new Babylonian name which gives honour to his own worldly god, though he acknowledges that "the spirit of **the holy gods** (presumably Father, Son and Spirit) is in" Daniel v8, 9. Then v10-17 is the content of the dream. v18 is the admission that Daniel gets his wisdom from "the spirit of the holy gods".

My old senior boss used to love to give me good news, but the bad stuff came from his understudy. Here Daniel is faced with sending bad news upwards to the top man v19. Daniel wishes it would be true for the king's enemies instead. The content is shared v20-23. Then the interpretation follows v24-26. The king will be "driven away from people and live with the beasts of the field for seven times" (years). Worse still he will eat grass and get wet like cattle all during this period. This nightmare, which people might label as insanity, will only end when he "Acknowledges that God the Most High is sovereign" over everything. Only after this can Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom be restored to him v26.

Daniel's deep concern for his king's wellbeing prompts him boldly to urge his king to repent and "renounce his sins, to act justly to those who are oppressed and to appeal to the Most High" in order that his prosperity may continue v27.

Knowing the future, is something many people crave, but I suspect only if it promises them positive rewards and "prosperity" of some kind or another. Nebuchadnezzar, however, faces 7 years of madness, living like a stubborn donkey, chewing grass and facing the heat, cold, wind, wet and dry of outdoor living.

This will be a most **humbling** time for someone who planned and oversaw such an impressive and powerful kingdom, one part of which was one of the seven wonders of the world. (The great hanging garden of Babylon - which no doubt was very fruitful, just like the tree described in Nebuchadnezzar's dream). Apparently, his great city had 100 gates, a 295 foot high temple-tower and a number of colossal gold statues which weighed many tons each.

The reality is that so many people we know are just as stubborn, and convinced that they can managed all their own affairs without needing to acknowledge God's sovereignty. Their image of God is sadly lacking and they will continue on a negative path until they go through their own **humbling** experience with God. Hopefully though, they too will learn the blessings and gain prosperity of acknowledging God in the years that they have left, and for eternity.

TEEN PAGE... MASKS... Last month we looked at the phenomenon of "the selfie", where it was all about revelling in our own appearance. This month I want to think about the complete opposite, hiding our true identities.



No doubt you'll have seen the latest craze that is sweeping the country. The Halloween clown. What began in the America has now reached East Lothian, with reported sightings of horror clowns coming in thick and fast. The idea is to dress up as a scary clown and jump out on unsuspecting passers-by. Schools have had to deal with potential hysteria and the police have had to issue statements of reassurance. So, have you ever worn a mask before? It can be fun to put on a mask and act like someone else. Why do people wear masks? To look like someone or something else. A mask hides what you really look like. Of course, taking it to extremes, masks can be worn

in the commission of a crime to conceal the culprit's identity.

Wrestling fans amongst you will recognise the term luchador! The wearing of masks in Mexican wrestling is hugely significant. The real identity of the wrestler is hidden allowing him to remain anonymous outside the ring (Ray Mysterio is a current example). The mask provides a mystique with the wrestler taking on a different persona. If a wrestler's mask was forcibly removed by an opponent, the loss of identity could mean the career ending. We all wear masks from time to time, if not all of the time! I don't mean a real mask over your face though. We constantly wear masks to conceal our true selves. Sometimes we act in a certain way so that people will think that we are better than we really are. We might come to church and say the right things, sing loudly, and act like a follower of Jesus, but it is really just a mask that we are wearing? Are we trying to fit in for a couple of hours on a Sunday morning?

Alternatively, we can conceal our faith, to fit in with the crowd and avoid awkward situations and potential conflict. It can be daunting to challenge some remark made or behaviour that's not right, far easier to acquiesce and hide behind a mask than speak up and reveal the real you.

In Matthew 23:25-26 we read about Jesus verdict on the religious leaders of the day.

"What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you Pharisees. Hypocrites! For you are so careful to clean the outside of the cup and the dish, but inside you are filthy—full of greed and self-indulgence! You blind Pharisee! First wash the inside of the cup and the dish, and then the outside will become clean, too.

Do you ever try to make yourself look better than you really are? Do you try to impress people? We all do this at times. God wants us to be humble. Instead of saying that we love God and other people, he wants us to actually love them! We show that we love Him by our actions, by how we live. While we can fool others sometimes, God is not fooled by the different masks we can try to hide behind.

In 1 Samuel 16:7, we read:

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

Take a few moments to think about the different masks you might hide behind and make a conscious decision to try to get rid of them so that our actions can be pleasing and honourable to God.

Punbar Old Cemetery

The number of headstones in Dunbar cemetery which have toppled in recent years has caused serious concern. The problem has been made worse by East Lothian's budget restrictions reducing the hours available to maintain the cemetery to former standards. One of the casualties has been the frequency of

trimming the grass. Rather than allowing the grass to grow around the bases of the stones, the decision was taken to control this by using weedkiller. As well as surface vegetation disappearing, roots binding the soil have also gone. Unfortunately this has led to soil erosion which has exposed the foundations of many stones to the elements. A combination of wind, water and frost has resulted in stones leaning and some eventually toppling and sometimes separating into sections.

Representatives of Dunbar Community Council, Dunbar Parish Church (Will Collin) and Dunbar History Society met with ELC's Principal Amenity Officer Stuart Pryde at the end of May, the meeting convened by ELC councillor Michael Veitch. It was agreed that a trial change of procedure would be applied to the two areas to the left and right of the roadway through the main gate and up to the church building. Spraying of those areas would stop with immediate effect.

At the end of this year's growing season, the missing top soil around the bases of the headstones in those areas would be replaced with a layer of poorer quality earth so that returning vegetation would not be too vigorous. This would be topped with better quality soil. In the section to the left (east), vegetation would be allowed to return naturally; to the right (west), wild flowers will be sown around the stones. This work will get underway in the next few weeks.

Hopefully this will go some way to reducing the issues of the stability of the headstones until such time as ELC can find a permanent solution to that problem. If the trial is successful it will likely be extended to other areas of the cemetery. It should be remembered that any resulting 'untidiness' around the stones during the trial period is not due to the Council failing to deliver its grass cutting to the established standard.
