Minister's Letter October 2018: Speaking the Truth

In the magazine we are going through the book of Romans. We are currently considering humanity's depraved nature in a section about the **wrath of God.** This helps us to see the need for God's justice e.g. should Hitler or serial killers go to heaven? I suspect most of us would say no.

Agreements on other moral behaviours are not always clearly as black or white as these may be. So the verses this month throw up essentially the most antagonistic topic in the church worldwide today.

The revisionists will shout "all are welcome" and when it comes to church, all people **are** welcome. None of us are sinless or have 'arrived yet'. Our task as a church is not to condemn or pre-judge. It is to love and share the gospel and God's values in order that we become more and more Christ-like as we press onwards in our faith **in** Christ Jesus.

Should we never read or preach on the parts of the Bible that speak about adultery or stealing if we have people in our church who are practicing these? Is it okay to say that these things are morally wrong and damaging to more than just themselves? Or is the risk of alienating them too much? So we humbly attend church to learn how to rightly worship God, to learn the things we need to change in ourselves, and to help others to be a part of God's family, no matter what their 'baggage' or practices are.

We cannot however be true to God by believing things that are contrary to His teaching or by hiding the truth away from people. If we love, then we cannot deceive, even if we think that the truth will be badly received.


Our country is in a mess in so many ways. People are enslaved by greedy employers, government policies that don't protect adequately or meet the needs of the vulnerable in our society, and the rich get richer living off of ill-gotten gains etc... And don't mention Brexit.

The Church in the western world has an up hill task in sharing the gospel to people who wrongly believe that they can live without any need of God right now, if at all. Many of them will hope to end up with Him in heaven for eternity when their time on earth is over - but is that how it works?

If we love God, then it is our duty to help everyone we can to discover the grace of God - none of us deserve or merit it, but there is nothing else in life that offers so great a prize. His way, His blessings, His help through all of our lives and a guarantee for all eternity. People need this, and need to hear about it. So who are you going to help?

Article Series 9 (pt 5) Doing what YOU want has consequences!

Please pray before you read Romans 1:24-32 Depravity

Last time we began to look at the **wrath** of God. We will come to see that it is based on *truth* and *righteousness* and is directed without prejudice or favouritism upon those whose spiritually and moral practices fall below His standards. (See chapter 2:3, 6-11) God's wrath is the right judgement upon *those* who reject Him and His ways. It is the **consequence** of *their* own making, especially as God intends His most incredible blessings and His most gracious love for us all.

In v24 we learn about the **consequences** of wilfully going against God's word; godless lives are wicked and eternally wasted. "The sinful desires of *their* hearts" darkens *their* practices leading to "**degrading** sexual impurity". In v25 Paul gives further details; *they* swap God's truth for worldly lies, worship false gods of their own making, and therefore lose the benefits of worshipping the one true God. This is deeply offensive to God and fatally wrong behaviour.

These sinful desires are then discussed further in v26, 27. It is lust and not love nor care for others that drives *them*. The natural relationships which God ordained for *their* benefit are exchanged for unnatural, which will do *them* grave harm. The word **perversion** is strong, but that is clear according to God's word. Today's culture, even in some church circles, pushes equality of things which are not truly equal, and redefines God ordained institutions like marriage to make it something which goes beyond the boundaries that God has set (Genesis 2) and it is catastrophic, divisive and misleading many people.

Some argue that it is not pastorally helpful to tell people that their lifestyles and life-choices are wrong in God's sight. Others say "God has got this wrong", or "this is not God's word", but in reality they are being idolatrous - saying that they know better than God, even though He has given His views clearly in His Word of Truth consistently and with no dubiety. God permits *them* to go the wrong way if *they* are so determined to do so. Despite this His hand of grace is still held out if they repent and see the folly of *their* ways. Divine eternal pleasures or temporary offensive lusts are the choices we all have.

Taking on wrong values and ideas affects our minds too and results in further dubious moral behaviours v28-31, "depraved minds, doing "what ought not to be done", and "filled with every kind of wickedness" are stark warnings. Many other things are listed in these verses as examples to avoid. Sin disconnects people from *truly* worshipping God, keeping the Sabbath Day holy etc?

v32 highlights the fact that "they" know what God's ways are, and that opposing these earns eternal death. Yet they continue to practice and approve of others who practice contrary to God's ways. This is serious and catastrophic.

Now a church that did not care for the lost, no matter their sins, would not be a church of Jesus Christ. So there is a juggle to show love to the lost without telling them lies in order to make them like us more, hate us less, or decide that we are bigoted and wrong etc. Jesus says that the "truth will set you free"

TEEN PAGE... DOUBTS!

When on holiday, I love visiting Cathedrals. I'm always amazed at the incredible architecture, craftsmanship and ornate design of churches that are often centuries old. The ones I visited this year, in Eastern Europe, have survived wars, ranging from an attack by Napoleon, through revolutions and two world wars. One even had a cannonball still embedded in the




wall. Then there were the changing political situations, taking them through different rulers and alliances, coming under the rule of Nazi Germany, then communism until the fall of the iron curtain in 1989. Throughout all of this, amazingly, these buildings stood strong, dominating the skyline.

In such ostentatious surroundings, it is easy to get caught up in gold leaf and archways and forget the purpose of the building: to worship God in. Sometimes our faith can replicate this. We may put on an impressive façade that can seem very grand on the surface, appearing to stand strong and tall above those around us, surviving everything that life can throw at us. In reality though, we may have lost sight of our purpose and our relationship with God is crumbling away. Our faith is all outward show but lacking genuine depth and substance. Have you ever experienced this? Are you someone who is plagued by doubts? Of course, we have the example of Thomas, one of the twelve disciples, known best as "doubting Thomas". Read and consider the account in John 20:24-29.

In one cathedral, I found a bowl containing texts. You could dip your hand in and choose one, seemingly at random. The one I got was from Mark 9:24, a father pleading with Jesus to heal his son. He states "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" What a truthful, genuine outpouring from a desperate man. If you are prone to experiencing doubts and questioning your faith, hold this verse close to your hearts and pray it with the same genuine, heartfelt sincerity.

Never forget this verse, cling to it. Doubt can eat away at your faith and drive a wedge between you and your saviour, so ask him for help to overcome it so you can draw closer to Jesus.
